Before you begin...

- Do you have categories for your courses?
- Do your categories have IDs?
 - This might come in handy
- When building your CSV, have this information ready

Check the Moodle Docs

- Documentation on Uploading Courses is at https://docs.moodle.org/32/en/Upload_courses
- You want to build a CSV file with all the course information
- The required fields are **shortname**, **fullname** and **category**

Different ways to specify category

- **category:** Probably the hardest to figure out - it's the id at the end of the URL for the category
- **category_idnumber:** Probably the most convenient - it's the id number you entered when building the category.
- **category_path:** Probably the easiest to figure out - it's the actual category hierarchy: i.e. "parent / subcategory"

Restoring from a Template

- **Super handy**
- Provide the short name of a course in your moodle
- This will become the template for your uploaded course
 - i.e. it will restore that course into your new course
 - i.e. it will copy what's in the template into your new course!

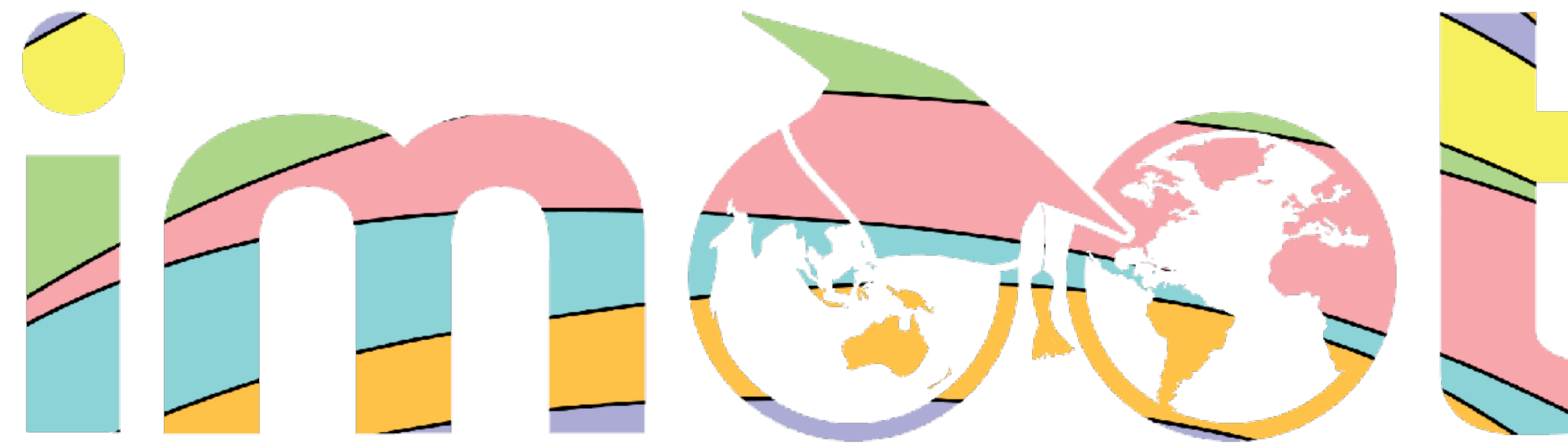
Enrolment Methods

- You can specify which enrolment methods you want to use
- You can use multiple values
 - First enrolment method would be enrolment_1
 - Specify a role or password for self enrolment
